# **ILLINOIS SENATE SEAT:**

## About This Race:

Current incumbent Tammy Duckworth (D) is seeking her first re-election as the junior senator from Illinois. She will be facing Kathy Salvi (R) in the general election this November. Senator Duckworth ran unopposed in the primary while seven challengers fought for the Republican nomination. Salvi narrowly beat out challenger Peggy Hubbard, who had been polling ahead, to win the nomination. If re-elected, Duckworth would be the first woman to be re-elected to the Senate in Illinois' history.

# Tammy Duckworth (D):

Current incumbent and junior Senator for Illinois, elected in 2016. Army veteran and former director of the Illinois Department of Veterans Affairs and former assistant secretary of the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs. Replaced incumbent Senator Mike Kirk after beating him in the general election. She currently serves the Committees for the Armed Forces, Small Business and Entrepreneurship, Commerce, Science, and Transportation, and Environment and Public Works.
